RE: Disposition of Driving Under the Influence and Driving with an Unlawful Alcohol
Concentration Cases in Greenwood Municipal Court (2011-03-21-88)

ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER

I FIND THAT, by Order of March 21, 2011, The Honorable Jean Hoefler Toal, Chief Justice of the South Carolina Supreme Court, ordered the prompt and efficient disposition of driving under the influence (DUI) and driving with an unlawful alcohol concentration (DUAC) cases in the Greenwood Municipal Court requires that cases, jury and non-jury, be called for trial.


I FURTHER FIND THAT, by Order of March 21, 2011, The Honorable Jean Hoefler Toal, Chief Justice of the South Carolina Supreme Court, found as of February 28, 2011, there were ninety-one (91) DUI and DUAC cases which have been pending in the Municipal Court of Greenwood for more than sixty (60) days in regards to jury and non-jury cases, and for more than one-hundred twenty (120) days in regards to jury cases.

I FURTHER FIND THAT, the prompt and efficient disposition of DUI and DUAC cases requires some motions to be heard well before trial.

NOW, THEREFORE, pursuant to the authority of that Order of The Honorable Jean Hoefler Toal, Chief Justice of the South Carolina Supreme Court, at 2011-02-04-01;

IT IS ORDERED THAT all motions to redact arrest or roadside video/audio recordings or Breathalyzer analysis video/audio recordings shall be heard no less than two (2) weeks prior to the term of Court for which the case is called, and if not made the motion to redact will be deemed abandoned should that case be called to trial; and,

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this administrative order shall take effect immediately, excepting the May 2011 terms for which motions to redact shall be made as promptly as possible.
