A VOICE IN GOVERNMENT

Annexation gives residents a means to influence policy and decisions that affect the entire community. By voting in city elections and serving on boards and committees, city residents can help shape the future of our community.

PUBLIC UTILITIES

Greenwood Commissioners of Public Works (CPW) and other departments provide reduced water costs, competitive electric and natural gas rates, street lighting, solid waste and residential trash services, street maintenance and other services.

Benefits to Residents and **Property Owners**

Annexation provides a wide variety of benefits to people who live, work and own property in the city limits.

FIRE AND POLICE PROTECTION

The City of Greenwood Fire Department has an ISO rating of 1, the highest possible designation, ranking it in the top 1% in the nation. The Greenwood Police Department provides 24-hour service throughout the city and has achieved international accreditation from the Commission on Accreditation for Law Enforcement Agencies. Since 1996, Greenwood has seen a 51.72% decrease in violent crime within the city and a 22.54% drop in property crimes.

ANNEXATION Q&A

What Is Annexation?

Under South Carolina law, cities and municipalities are able to expand their boundaries through the legal process of annexation. In this process, the land becomes part of the city (as opposed to the county), and its residents and property owners are entitled to all of the benefits and amenities provided by the city.

Does the City Have the Authority to Annex Property?

The South Carolina General Assembly grants cities and municipalities the right to annex contiguous parcels of land (property that touches any boundary of the existing city limits). The legislature also sets limits on annexation and lays out the responsibilities of the city to the owners of annexed property.

How Does Annexation Work?

There are several ways that annexation can occur, from individual petitions for annexation to the annexation of large parcels of land. Please contact the city if you have questions about your property, subdivision or commercial development.

Incentives & Contacts

Large Scale Annexation Incentives

A joint program of the City of Greenwood and CPW offers incentives and reimbursements for property improvement to developers of large subdivisions and commercial properties inside the city limits. Incentive and reimbursements programs are available for road and storm sewer construction and are based on the pace of development.
